#### A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

It's been an interesting year. Having volunteered at the Pantry for the past eight years, I thought I had a pretty good idea of how things worked. My year as Board President has opened my eyes. Patty and the staff (both hereinafter 'staff') are much more amazing than I had realized.

With a grant from the Greater Boston Food Bank (GBFB) and assistance from Senator Jamie Eldridge we purchased a truck to use to get supplies from GBFB. A great design was conceived by staff and put on the truck to advertise the Pantry's services wherever it traveled. Board member Jeff Howe coordinated schedules with 6 other food pantries so that we could obtain GBFB supplies for them as well. A tremendous benefit for them and a wonderful example of non-profits cooperating for the benefit of clients.

Then the Board decided to engage in a formal planning process to try to improve services to clients as the COVID crises stabilized. The staff spent considerable time using their expertise to develop a staged plan which they presented to the Board. The first stage is now in effect, giving clients more options as to when to get food. Other stages will be implemented over time.

In spite of some significant staff turn-over (some anticipated, some not) services to clients never decreased. A special shout-out to the volunteers on our Personnel Committee who spent many hours screening and discussing dozens of candidates for our open positions this year: Aleta Manugian, Leslie Row, Jeff Howe, Mary Timmons, and Andrea Myette.

On behalf of our clients, I thank the Board, the staff and all our volunteers for their efforts. I'm looking forward to seeing what this next year will bring. Whatever it is, I know our clients will be well taken care of.



### **SUPPORT**



#### **FAMILIES VISITED LAST YEAR!**

Those 576 families had 1,510 household members. They sought help for many different reasons - a job loss, health issues, fixed income, addiction, abuse and even an unexpected household expense which they did not have the resources for. Each family, if they visited twice each month, received enough groceries for approximately half of their monthly meals. Groceries included: Fresh and frozen produce, eggs, margarine, cheese, frozen meats, cereal, juice, pasta, pasta sauce, rice, helpers, condiments, canned products, personal care items and vouchers for milk.

## **ASSIST**



WERE OVER THE AGE OF 65!

Seniors are a very proud group. We often hear that they "don't want to take food away from those who need it more." The reality is that many seniors are struggling to stretch their fixed income to pay their bills. They are making some very difficult decisions about heating their home, paying their rent or mortgage, purchasing necessary medications or buying nutritious food. Often, there is little left for groceries.



It takes a lot of food to feed 576 families! We could not possibly have managed without the support of the community who provided financial support, food, personal care products, and the gift of volunteer time. Together we lightened the load for 1,510 of our neighbors.
