FAMILIES VISITED LAST YEAR!

The Pantry helped 2,497 individuals from 891 families last year, an increase of 34% from the previous year. They struggled with job loss, health issues, fixed income, an unexpected household expense, and the dramatic increase in the cost of food, housing, and utilities. The Pantry welcomed each family and provided them with groceries, resources, kindness, and support.

Many seniors struggled to survive on their fixed income and were forced to make some very difficult decisions about heating their home, paying their rent or mortgage, or purchasing necessary medications. This generation was hesitant to ask for help but was relieved when they found the courage to visit the Pantry.

WERE CHILDREN!

Many parents told us they were struggling to provide adequate, nutritious food for their children. Trying to stretch a box of pasta or a can of soup was the norm for many until they came to the Pantry. The fresh produce, meats, eggs, and milk vouchers they received provided the little ones with the nutrition they needed to be healthy and succeed at school.

WERE RETIRED OR DISABLED!

Their stories were heartbreaking. They were struggling to survive on a fixed income. Some reentered the workforce, but others could not work due to illness or a handicap. They were doing their best to survive. The support they received from the Pantry sustained them and lightened the burden.

EARNED LESS THAN \$25,000!

With the cost of living skyrocketing, surviving on less than \$25,000 annually is nearly impossible. Many reported living in low-income housing, area hotels, or were homeless. Many did not know where their next meal was coming from. Some survived on crackers and peanut butter; some went hungry. The support they received from the Pantry helped, in a small way, to comfort them.


